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## DRIVEN WOLF HUNT

**Location:** St. Petersburg, Karelia, 200-300 miles from St. Petersburg

**Season dates:** January 25-March 15

**Details:** The number of wolves in the St. Petersburg region and Karelia has been increasing for the past two decades despite active hunting, which has a huge adverse impact on the number of moose and wild boar in this part of Russia. We offer a traditional driven flagged wolf hunt. This requires locating a pack, consisting of 3 to 6 animals, surrounding it with a rope approximately 3.5-5 miles (5-8 km) long with a narrow opening where shooters are located, and pushing wolves towards the shooting line. Shots are taken from a short distance, usually using 12 gauge shotguns loaded with buckshot. Drives are organized every other day. Hunters should be in good physical condition, dressed in layers and wearing snow camo suits. Additionally, hunters can choose to hunt lynx or wolverine with the dogs.





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## DUCKS IN THE VOLGA DELTA

**Location:** Volga River Delta

**Season dates:** September 1-December 31

**Hunting method:** from the boat blind over decoys

**Accommodations:** floating hotel

**Details:** Volga River Delta, a breeding ground for almost 1 million birds, is one the best locations in Europe for waterfowl hunting. The region offers a wide variety of waterfowl, among which there are over a dozen species of ducks, including mallard, gadwall, northern shoveler, northern pintail, smew, ruddy shelduck, European wigeon, greater scaup, tufted duck, red-crested pochard, garganey, and green-winged teal, as well as grey lag, bean, and white-fronted goose. The best time is the first few days of the season and from November 15 until the end of the season. Late-season weather is usually not cold, with temperatures generally staying above freezing.



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## WINTER/SPRING EASTERN CAPERCAILLIE

**Location:** Yelizovo district, Kamchatka peninsula

**Season dates:** January 12-February 28; May 12-21

**Hunting method:** stalking

**Accommodations:** hunting cabin, hotel

**Details:** Black billed or Western capercaillie hunt is done by stalking along the roads during the winter season and on the lek during the spring season. Unlike western capercaillie, which loses hearing during a particular part of mating song, Eastern capercaillie maintains good hearing at all times, making stalking very difficult. Bringing winter clothes in layers is important to adjust to any air temperature.

**Details:** Eurasian lynx found in Russian taiga forests is the largest among the species. Mature males can exceed 30 kg (65 lbs). Lynx is almost exclusively hunted with dogs. The best time is early in the season when the snow cover is not too deep, and the dogs can move freely, or later in the season when it is deep enough to use snowmobiles. Temperature can be as low as -25C to -40C (-10F to -40F). This hunt has been 100% successful. Additional trophies include wolf or wolverine.





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## FALL AMUR BROWN BEAR HUNT

**Location:** Sovetsko-Gavansky district, Khabarovsk krai

**Season dates:** September 10 – October 30

**Hunting method:** Spot and stock

**Accommodations:** Remote cabin with an electric generator, satellite phone, sauna

Finding bears at this time of the year is easy and most hunters take their trophy.

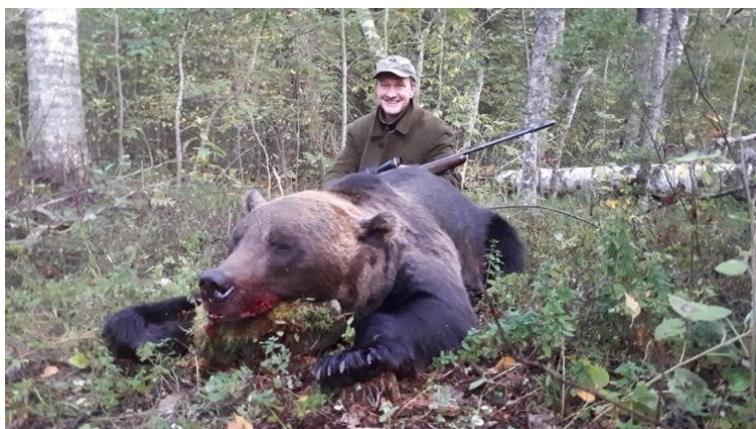

**Details:** These are some of the best hunts in the European part of Russia. The bear population during the past 20 years has been very stable. The usual trophy size is about 7 ft., although 8 - 8.5 ft. bears have been taken by our clients every year. The record bear taken in the Pskov region in 1999 had a skull measured in excess of 27 inches (69 cm) The success rate is about 90%. Some hunters take more than one bear. The weather is usually mild and can be rainy. Moose hunt can be added from September 5 and wolverine can be added from September 15. Baiting by meat in the northern part of Karelia makes this hunt suitable for bow.

Baiting by planted oats is used in the areas closer to St. Petersburg. Each additional trophy requires 3 extra days of hunting. Moose requires extra 3 days of hunting.





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## FALL EUROPEAN WOODCOCK HUNT IN KAERLIA AND ST. PETERSBURG

**Location:** St. Petersburg, Novgorod, Karelia

**Season dates:** September 15 – October 20

**Hunting method:** Over dogs

With good dogs during the peak season, hunters can expect to have 15-30 flashes per day. For best results, hunters should be prepared to walk up to 15 kilometers over heavily forested terrain each day. Other birds, including black grouse, hazel grouse and snipe can be taken too. Package prices are based on hunters bringing their dogs. Our dogs can be provided for an additional fee.

**Details:** The camp is located south of 15,000 ft. Kamen volcano, and north of a large federal wildlife preserve. The preserve provides a constant supply of trophy bears. Bear hunt in the fall season is conducted by spot and stalk over blueberry patches, dwarf pine thickets, reach in pine nuts and salmon streams. During this time of the year, bears are so preoccupied with eating that often they allow hunters to come within 50-100 yards. Hunters should expect to spend 2-3 days at a time away from the base camp, staying overnight in hunting tents or shacks. Rains are common, sometimes keeping hunters inside of cabins for a few days.







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## HIMALAYAN SNOWCOCK AND DAURIAN PARTRIDGE

**Location:** near Chaldybar, Kyrgyzstan

**Season dates:** September - November

**Hunting method:** Spot and stock, no horses

**Accommodations:** Base camp - cabin with electric generator and running water; spike camps

**Number of hunters:** 2-4

**Details:** The Himalayan snowcock is a solitary and elusive bird, requiring excellent knowledge of the habitat, patience, and stamina for a successful hunt. We recommend using rifles chambered for small caliber ammo, including 17 Hornet, 17 Rem, 22-250, 220 Swift, 223 Rem, and 22 Hornet, loaded with FMJ bullets. Shooting distance is between 100-200 meters. 22 LR may not work. If time allows, hunters may shoot Daurian partridge, native pheasants, and red-legged partridge at lower elevations. The best time is late October - early November when the snow pushes the birds from higher elevations, and the birds form flocks. The base camp is approximately a 5-hour drive from Bishkek at 2000 m (7,000 ft) above sea level. The spike camp is 3-4 hours away from the base camp, at 10,000 ft above sea level. The snowcock hunt is by foot, at about 3-3,500 m (10,111,000 ft).





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## MOOSE HUNT IN KAMCHATKA PENINSULA

**Location:** Ust-Kamchatsky district, Kamchatka peninsula

**Season dates:** September 27 – October 10

**Hunting method:** Spot and stock

**Accommodations:** Remote cabin with electric generator, satellite phone, hot shower, sauna **Group size:** 2-4

**Details:** Kamchatka moose, genetically identical to Chukotka moose (*Alces alces buturlini*), is one of the largest moose subspecies in the world. Kamchatka peninsula moose population is close to 6000 and it is getting larger. Hunt is conducted by spot and stock. Later in the season, with the foliage down, spotting moose above the brush becomes easier. Hunters should expect to spend 2-3 days at a time away from the base camp, staying overnight in hunting tents or shacks. Rains are common, sometimes keeping hunters inside of cabins for a few days.





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## KAMCHATKA SNOW SHEEP HUNT

**Location:** Ust-Kamchatsky district, Kamchatka peninsula

**Season dates:** August 3 - September 18 (Aug 3-16, Aug 14-27, Aug 27-Sep 7, Sep 5-18)

**Hunting method:** Spot and stock

**Accommodations:** Heated tents, electric generator, satellite phone, radio

**Number of hunters:** 1-4

**Price:** \$24,500

**Additional trophies:** Bear \$5000

**Details:** The camp is located in the middle of the sheep country at 3000 ft (900 m) above sea level. Hunters can expect to see several rams during the trip. The hunt is not very demanding physically, requiring walking about 6 miles a day. Trophy size ranges from 35 to 43 inches, 37 inches average. Hunters capable of walking longer distances tend to get better trophies. The daytime temperature hovers around 70F (20C) in August. Long rains with strong winds are not uncommon. There could be occasional nighttime snowfalls towards the end of the season, but the snow does not stay on the ground for more than a few hours. Hunters can take a brown bear near the base camp, a half-day walk from the spike camp if time allows.





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## MARAL STAG AND SIBERIAN ROE DEER IN KAZAKHSTAN

**Location:** Shal-Akyn district, Kazakhstan

**Season dates:** July 15-December 15

**Hunting method:** stalking, driven hunts for groups of 3-6

**Accommodations:** fully equipped hunting cabin with electricity, running water, bathroom and shower

The best time for Siberian roe deer is July 20-November 30. In December, when snow cover gets deep, hunters may have to use skis. Maral and roe deer hunts can be combined between September 15 and November 30. Trophies are excellent, with stags reaching 17 kg and Siberian roe deer often exceeding 1000 gr. Wolf can be taken as a trophy of opportunity. Shooting distance is between 100-400 yards.





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## MARAL STAG IN ALTAI

**Location:** Ust'-Koksa, Altai, Russia

**Details:** Kyrgyzstan argali is, on average smaller than Tajikistan. However, trophies well over 50 inches and up to 60 are not unusual. A car ride from Bishkek to the hunting area takes about 7 hours. The base camp is located at 3,200 meters (10,500 ft.) above sea level. The camp has warm cabins, an indoor toilet, running water, and electricity from the generator. There is a satellite phone for emergencies. Hunting takes place at altitudes of 3,000 - 4,000 meters (9,500 - 12,500 ft.) and requires good physical endurance. Hunters should expect to spend up to 6-8 hours per day riding horses. Daytime temperature is around +10C (+50F) in the fall and -20C (-4F) in the winter. At night it can drop to -40C (-40F). Shots are expected within 300-600 yards range, therefore flat shooting rifle with good optics and a range finder is necessary.

The success rate is over 100% because all hunters take 2 and sometimes more bears. Rocky terrain and short brush allow approaching bears within a short distance making this hunt perfect for bow hunters.

Still you may need to make more than one attempt. The temperature can range from -10C to +15C (10F to 60F). Trophies must be either frozen, or skinned by a taxidermist. Bring a pair of rubber hip boots, warm gloves a hat and a waterproof, quiet jacket. Hunters should be prepared to face a major sleep disruption, because capercaillie hunt starts around midnight and black cock just before sunrise. Hunters who have enough energy could hunt woodcocks during the evening mating flight.
